
Our staff has performed admirably throughout this time of increased demand, maintaining timeliness rates of over 95 percent (one of the highest in the state). Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (SNAP Food Stamps)

The Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (SNAP Food Stamps) is MCBOSS' largest program. As you can see in the chart below, the number of applications tripled from 2019 to 2022. The upward trend remains for the first half of 2023, with almost 9,900 applications filed between January and June.

TEMPORARY ASSISTANCE FOR NEEDY FAMILIES (TANF) AND GENERAL ASSISTANCE (GA)

Some of the agency's clients receive TANF and GA cash assistance in addition to SNAP. The total number of applications for new TANF and GA cases nearly tripled from 2019 to 2022, as shown in the chart below. Also shown, new applications in 2023 are on trend to outnumber the 2022 applications.
